Notes on the Tables of Extreme Maxima and Minima

Reference should be made to notes in Meaden and Webb (1984) and Webb and Meaden (1993 and 2000) where the development of standard instrumentation and exposure are also discussed (see also Butler, 1914):

1. An * (asterisk) against the station location indicates that the site was rather sheltered. In some cases, like with Camden Square, the site may still have been representative of the immediate locality. Drummond (1946) provides a photograph of the Camden Square site, while Burt and Eden (2004) include a photograph of the Gravesend (Swanscombe) site.
2. The temperature of 38.5°C reported from Faversham, Kent, on 10 August 2003 has been omitted. A detailed review by Burt and Eden (2004) raised considerable doubts regarding whether the reading was representative of the location. Other sites and extremes were reviewed in the same paper but were found to be much better supported by readings from neighbouring stations.
3. All extremes are based on the traditional 0900–0900 GMT climatological observational ‘day’. On clear winter mornings, the ‘overnight’ minimum (especially in Scotland) occurs close to the 0900 GMT standard observation hour. Hence, some very cold nights have almost certainly entered the records on two consecutive 0900–0900 GMT ‘climatological days’. Such cases are marked with ♦ after the year.
4. Before 1962, most readings were recorded in whole degrees Fahrenheit although some were read to 0.1°F and a few to the nearest 0.5°F. Temperatures were reported in tenths of a degree Celsius from 1962, although for a few years thereafter, some were converted from whole degrees Fahrenheit. In the last 40 years, the practice has been to read thermometers to 0.1°C.

In the case of qualified (asterisked) extremes in Appendix C, the next highest recorded value is presented on a separate line. Additional values for a date are also indicated where:

- i. Other readings ‘round’ to the same whole degree Fahrenheit as the reported daily extreme (see above).
- ii. The absolute extreme was recorded by an automatic weather station.
- iii. The values are of special historical interest (especially in the context of the locations where they were recorded).

A Note on British Counties Referred To in the Tables

The counties quoted are based on the Lieutenancy areas of Britain, although the following should be noted:

1. In England, current ceremonial (Lieutenancy) county boundaries have been used. Not only do these correspond more closely to the traditional counties, but they are considered much more stable than administrative divisions where small unitary authorities are become more numerous.
2. In Wales, the current Lieutenancy areas, also known as the preserved counties (which closely correspond to the 1974–1996 administrative regions), include four large entities: Gwynedd, Clwyd, Powys and Dyfed. Three of these, Gwynedd, Clwyd and Dyfed, have administrative subdivisions which correspond closely to pre-1974 ‘traditional counties’, and these have been used. There is no administrative subdivision for Powys.
3. In Scotland, the current Lieutenancy areas have been used. They correspond closely to the traditional pre-1974 county boundaries with a few alterations such as Skye and Lochalsh now being within Ross and Cromarty rather than Inverness-shire. Peeblesshire is sometimes known as Tweeddale.

On several dates, the record maxima for mainland Britain have been exceeded in the Channel Islands. For these days, both respective highs are presented. Further details of records from Jersey stations are provided by Le Blancq (2005).

Ireland Extremes

The table of county extremes includes those for the counties of Northern Ireland. Extremes for each of the five provinces covering the whole of Ireland are also provided, these corresponding to those used in Met Eireann forecasts.

General Note

We currently believe that the unqualified extremes presented in the attached tables are accurate and representative of standard conditions of exposure. However, it is possible that future research may result in a reassessment of some of these values (Dukes and Eden 1997, Eden 1991, Burt and Eden 2004).

Sources and Acknowledgements

The principal sources used in this and previous papers on extreme temperatures in Britain have been the *Monthly Weather Report*, *Daily Weather Report*, and *Daily Weather Summary*, published by The Met. Office; also (up to 1911), the *Meteorological Record* of the Royal Meteorological Society and the *Reports on the Meteorology of Scotland* (published in the *Journal of the Scottish Meteorological Society*); also sundry reports published in the *Meteorological Magazine*, *Weather*, and *The Journal of Meteorology, United Kingdom*. Special thanks are due to staff at the National Meteorological Archive, Bracknell and more recently Exeter, for access to the numerous original observer returns which have been scrutinised; also the Meteorological Archives, Edinburgh, for further

notes on 1993 and 1995 extreme minima. We are very grateful for the various other communications and feedback which we have received on this subject, some of them responding to previous articles.
